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Month of the Spirit

JOHN 6:63

"The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life."

As we enter the month of June, we dedicate this time to understanding and living by the Spirit. This is a season to become spiritually conscious, to recognise that our true life is sustained by the Spirit of God. Many believers live only aware of the physical realm, yet God calls us to function from the Spirit. This month will guide you into deeper fellowship, sensitivity, and growth in the Holy Spirit.

Understanding the Month of the Spirit

The Spirit is not optional but essential. Charles Finney highlighted that "without the Holy Spirit, Christianity becomes powerless." A Spirit-led life produces power and transformation.

God invites you into deeper fellowship. When you focus on the Spirit, your life becomes guided, refined, and empowered.

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The Spirit, Soul and Body

1 THESSALONIANS 5:23

"May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Understanding the nature of man is essential for spiritual growth. Many believers confuse the soul with the spirit, yet the Bible clearly shows that man is made of three parts: spirit, soul, and body. When this order is misunderstood, life becomes unbalanced. But when the spirit leads, guided by the Holy Spirit, the soul and body come into proper alignment.

Understanding the Spirit, Soul and Body

1. Man is a Three-Part Being

Scripture reveals that we are spirit, soul, and body. Watchman Nee explains that "the spirit is the deepest part of man where God dwells." The body is physical, the soul is the mind, will, and emotions, but the spirit is where divine connection happens.

2. The Spirit is the Real You

Your spirit is your true identity. Kenneth Hagin taught that "you are not a body with a spirit, you are a spirit that has a body." This understanding changes how you live and relate to God.

3. The Soul Must Be Governed by the Spirit

The soul contains your thoughts and emotions, but it must not lead. Dr Yonggi Cho emphasised that "when the soul leads, confusion follows, but when the spirit leads, clarity comes."

4. The Body Must Be Subject to the Spirit

The body responds to physical desires, but it must be disciplined. Charles Finney taught that "a life ruled by the body leads to weakness, but a life ruled by the spirit leads to strength."

5. Alignment Brings Stability

When your spirit is in fellowship with God, your soul becomes stable and your body becomes disciplined. This is the order God designed.

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The Invisible Side of a Person

2 CORINTHIANS 4:18

"So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

There is an invisible side to every person that determines the outcome of their life. While many focus on outward appearance and physical realities, God looks at the inner man. Your spirit is the unseen part of you, yet it holds the greatest influence over your life. Developing your inner man is essential for spiritual growth and lasting transformation.

Understanding the Invisible Side of a Person

1. The Inner Man is the Real Man

The unseen part of you is your true self. Watchman Nee taught that "the outward man perishes, but the inward man must be renewed daily." What happens inside you shapes your life.

2. Spiritual Realities Are Eternal

What is seen is temporary, but the unseen is eternal. Kenneth Hagin emphasised that "the spirit realm is more real than the physical realm." Understanding this changes your priorities.

3. Your Inner Condition Determines Your Outer Life

If your spirit is strong, your life reflects it. Charles Finney taught that "revival begins within before it manifests outwardly." Transformation starts inside.

4. The Inner Man Must Be Developed

Just like the body, your spirit must grow. Dr Yonggi Cho emphasised that "prayer and the Word build the inner man." Without development, your spirit remains weak.

5. God Works from the Inside Out

God transforms you internally before externally. This is the pattern of true spiritual growth.

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Being Born Again

JOHN 3:6

"Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit."

Being born again is the foundation of the Christian life. It is not a physical change but a spiritual transformation that takes place within a person. Many people attend church or follow religious practices, yet they have not experienced the true rebirth of the spirit. When a person is born again, their human spirit is made alive unto God, enabling them to have a genuine relationship with Him.

Understanding Being Born Again

1. The New Birth is a Spiritual Experience

Jesus makes it clear that being born again is of the Spirit. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the new birth is the recreation of the human spirit." It is not external but internal.

2. The Spirit is Made Alive to God

Before salvation, the human spirit is separated from God. Watchman Nee explains that "the spirit of man is dead toward God until it is quickened by Him." Being born again restores that connection.

3. Old Nature is Replaced by New Life

Connecting with God Through Your Human Spirit

ROMANS 8:16

"The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children."

God relates to us through our spirit, not through our physical senses. Many believers struggle to hear God because they look for Him externally, yet He communicates internally through the human spirit. Learning to connect with God through your spirit is essential for spiritual growth and intimacy.

Understanding Connecting with God Through Your Spirit

1. God Communicates Spirit to Spirit

God is Spirit, and He communicates through the spirit. Kenneth Hagin taught that "God speaks to the inward man, not the outward man."

Understanding the Holy Spirit's Guidance

Guidance comes internally. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the inward witness is the primary way God leads His children."

2. God's Children Are Led by the Spirit

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Overcoming the Evil in a Human Heart

JEREMIAH 17:9

"The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?"

One of the greatest battles in the life of a believer is the battle against the corruption that can be found in the human heart. The heart of man, without the influence of God, can easily become a place of pride, bitterness, lust, envy, hatred, and rebellion. Many people focus only on outward appearance and behaviour, but God looks deeper. He examines the condition of the heart. This is why true transformation must begin from within. Victory over evil does not come by human effort alone, but by the cleansing power of God and the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit.

Understanding Overcoming the Evil in a Human Heart

1. The Natural Human Heart is Fallen

Jeremiah 17:9 reveals the true condition of the human heart without God. It is deceitful and unreliable. Charles G. Finney taught that "man's greatest problem is not first his environment but the corruption within." This is why people can appear good outwardly yet still struggle inwardly. Without God, the heart can lead a person into wrong desires and wrong decisions. We must never trust the flesh above the Word of God.

2. God is the Only One Who Truly Knows the Heart

Many people misunderstand themselves because the heart can hide its true motives. Only God can search it fully. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the Word of God exposes what the human mind tries to excuse." When we come before God sincerely, He reveals what must change within us. This is necessary because healing begins when truth is revealed.

3. The Holy Spirit Purifies the Inner Man

You cannot cast out carnality by willpower alone. The Holy Spirit must work within you. Watchman Nee emphasised that "the cross deals with the old man, and the Spirit works out that victory in daily life." As you yield to the Holy Spirit, He convicts, corrects, and purifies your inner life. He breaks the hold of bitterness, pride, selfish ambition, and every hidden corruption.

4. The Word of God Cleanses the Heart

The Word is not just information. It is cleansing power. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "when the Word enters the heart, it uproots darkness and plants divine life." The more you feed on Scripture, the more your heart is corrected. What fills your heart will eventually shape your speech, your choices, and your life. This is why guarding what enters your heart is so important.

5. A Yielded Heart Becomes a Vessel for God's Glory

When your heart is surrendered, God can trust you with more. He can fill you, guide you, and use you. Jack Coe often preached that "God moves through yielded vessels." A heart that has been humbled before God becomes a place where His power can dwell. True victory is not only avoiding evil, but becoming a vessel of purity, love, and obedience.

CLOSING PRAYER

My heart is purified by the Word of God and transformed by the Holy Spirit.

Heavenly Father, thank You for revealing the truth about the human heart. Search me and expose anything within me that does not please You. 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Learning Spiritual Things

1 CORINTHIANS 2:14

"The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit."

Spiritual things cannot be understood by natural reasoning alone. This is one of the great frustrations of many believers. They try to understand the things of God only with the mind, while neglecting the role of the Spirit. God's truths are not merely academic concepts. They are spiritual realities that must be revealed by the Holy Spirit. The believer who wants to grow must learn how to receive spiritual understanding by depending on the Spirit of God.

Understanding Learning Spiritual Things

1. Spiritual Truth Requires Spiritual Discernment

Paul makes it clear that natural understanding alone is not enough. The things of God must be discerned spiritually. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the Bible was not written merely to inform the mind but to feed the spirit." This means that spiritual learning begins when the inner man becomes receptive to God. A person may be intelligent in worldly matters and still remain dull concerning spiritual truth.

2. The Natural Mind Has Limitations

Human reasoning has value, but it cannot take the place of revelation. Watchman Nee explained that "the mind may analyse truth, but only the spirit can truly receive it." This is why some truths may seem simple in words, yet carry deep power when revealed by the Spirit. We must never depend only on intellect when approaching the things of God.

3. The Holy Spirit is the Teacher of Spiritual Things

Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit would teach us. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "the Holy Spirit gives life to the Word and opens its meaning to the believer." When you read Scripture prayerfully, the Spirit begins to illuminate what is hidden. He takes truth beyond the page and plants it into your spirit. This is how revelation becomes personal.

4. Humility is Necessary for Spiritual Learning

Pride blocks revelation. A proud heart thinks it already knows enough. Charles G. Finney taught that "a teachable spirit is a sign of grace at work." If you want to learn spiritual things, you must remain humble before God. The Holy Spirit teaches those who are willing to listen, willing to be corrected, and willing to grow.

5. Practice Deepens Revelation

Spiritual truth becomes clearer when it is obeyed. Jack Coe often emphasised that power flows through believers who act on what God has shown them. When you apply spiritual truths in prayer, worship, obedience, and daily life, understanding grows deeper. Revelation is not only for admiration. It is for transformation.

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Singing Spiritual Hymns

EPHESIANS 5:19

"Speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord."

There is deep spiritual power in songs that come from the heart and are inspired by the Spirit. Singing spiritual hymns is not just a musical activity. It is a way of ministering to God, strengthening your spirit, building an atmosphere of faith, and driving away heaviness. Many believers underestimate what happens when they sing unto the Lord in sincerity. Songs from the Spirit refresh the inner man and create room for the presence of God to move.

Understanding Singing Spiritual Hymns

1. Spiritual Songs Build the Inner Man

When you sing from your heart to God, your spirit is strengthened. Kenneth Hagin taught that "spiritual songs stir faith and help the believer remain conscious of God's presence." Singing is not merely emotional expression. It is spiritual edification. A believer who sings unto the Lord with understanding is feeding their spirit with life.

2. Worship Creates a Godly Atmosphere

Atmospheres matter in the spirit. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "praise shifts the environment of the heart and invites the operation of the Holy Spirit." When spiritual songs fill a place, oppression begins to lose its hold. Fear, heaviness, and confusion are challenged by the presence of God. This is why worship is such a powerful part of the believer's life.

3. Singing from the Heart Matters More Than Performance

God is not looking for performance but sincerity. Watchman Nee emphasised that "what comes from the spirit reaches God more than what comes merely from the lips." Spiritual hymns are effective when they are genuine. The heart must be engaged. God receives songs that come from love, reverence, and fellowship.

4. Songs Can Carry Revelation and Healing

Many times, God ministers through worship in ways words alone cannot express. Jack Coe preached in revival meetings where songs helped prepare the people for healing and deliverance. Spiritual songs can bring comfort to the broken, peace to the troubled, and fresh faith to the weary. The Holy Spirit often uses worship to unlock the hearts of believers.

5. A Singing Believer is Often a Strengthened Believer

People who remain full of spiritual songs tend to remain spiritually refreshed. Charles G. Finney observed that seasons of deep worship often preceded seasons of revival. When songs of the Spirit fill your life, murmuring loses space, and gratitude increases. Spiritual hymns help keep your heart fixed on God.

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Discernment of Spirits

1 CORINTHIANS 12:10

"...to another distinguishing between spirits..."

Not everything that appears spiritual is from God. One of the most important gifts and disciplines in the life of a believer is discernment. In a world full of deception, false appearances, and spiritual confusion, believers must learn how to distinguish between what is of God, what is of man, and what is of the enemy. Discernment of spirits is essential for protection, for wisdom, and for walking accurately with God.

Understanding Discernment of Spirits

1. Not Every Spirit is from God

The presence of spiritual activity does not automatically mean God is involved. Kenneth Hagin taught that "believers must not be carried away by every spiritual manifestation." Some things may appear powerful, emotional, or supernatural, yet not come from the Holy Spirit. This is why discernment is necessary.

2. Discernment Protects the Believer from Deception

Many errors in the Christian life come from lack of discernment. Watchman Nee emphasised that "without spiritual discernment, believers may confuse soul power with spiritual power." The enemy often disguises himself in subtle ways. Discernment helps you avoid deception and remain rooted in truth.

3. The Holy Spirit Gives Clarity

Discernment is not suspicion or fear. It is spiritual clarity. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "the Holy Spirit reveals what cannot be seen by natural observation." There are times when the Spirit warns you inwardly, gives you unrest about something, or opens your eyes to what lies beneath the surface. This is His protection at work.

4. The Word of God is the Standard for Discernment

All discernment must be tested by Scripture. Charles G. Finney taught that "whatever contradicts the character and truth of God must be rejected." Even impressions, dreams, prophecies, and experiences must be judged by the Word. The Holy Spirit never leads contrary to the truth He inspired in Scripture.

5. A Pure Life Sharpens Discernment

A compromised life can dull spiritual senses. Jack Coe often preached that holiness and power go together. The more yielded you are to God, the clearer your discernment becomes. Sin, carnality, and constant distraction make the spirit less sharp. But prayer, purity, and fellowship with God increase your ability to perceive rightly.

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Your Human Spirit Needs Fellowship with God's Holy Spirit

2 CORINTHIANS 13:14

"May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

The Christian life was never meant to be lived without fellowship with the Holy Spirit. Many believers know about the Holy Spirit, but they do not actively commune with Him. Your human spirit was designed to interact with God's Spirit. Without this fellowship, spiritual dryness easily develops. But when your spirit remains in communion with the Holy Spirit, strength, guidance, peace, and spiritual sensitivity increase.

Understanding Fellowship with the Holy Spirit

1. Fellowship with the Holy Spirit is a Daily Necessity

Paul speaks of the fellowship of the Holy Spirit as something real and ongoing. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the Holy Spirit is not merely a force to use but a person to know." Fellowship means relationship, communion, and awareness. It is not enough to acknowledge Him only in church moments. He desires daily interaction.

2. Your Human Spirit Was Made for Divine Communion

God created man with the capacity to know Him deeply. Watchman Nee explained that "the spirit is the organ by which man communes with God." This means that true spiritual life depends on fellowship. When your spirit is disconnected from communion with God, you may still be religious outwardly, but inwardly you begin to weaken.

3. Fellowship Produces Sensitivity

The more you spend time with the Holy Spirit, the more you become sensitive to His voice and workings. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "intimacy with the Spirit increases spiritual awareness." His promptings become clearer. His peace becomes more noticeable. His corrections become more meaningful. Fellowship makes your spirit alert.

4. Fellowship Strengthens the Inner Man

A believer who neglects fellowship can become spiritually weak even while remaining busy. Charles G. Finney stressed the importance of maintaining a living connection with God. Times of prayer, worship, meditation on the Word, and stillness before God all strengthen the inner man. Fellowship is where your spirit is refreshed.

5. Intimacy with the Holy Spirit Produces Fruit and Power

The power of the believer does not come from noise or activity alone. It flows from communion with God. Jack Coe ministered with visible power, but revival ministries like his were built on deep dependence on the Holy Spirit. Fellowship produces both character and power. It causes the believer to walk in strength and purity.

CLOSING PRAYER

My spirit remains in fellowship with the Holy Spirit, and I grow stronger in God daily.

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Avoid Substances That Harm Your Human Spirit

1 CORINTHIANS 6:19

"Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God?"

The believer must understand that what affects the body can also affect spiritual sensitivity. Many people only think about physical consequences when it comes to harmful substances, but there are also spiritual consequences. Anything that clouds the mind, weakens discipline, opens the door to bondage, or dulls your awareness of God can become dangerous to your spiritual life. Because your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, it must be treated with honour and discipline.

Understanding Avoiding Substances That Harm Your Spirit

1. Your Body is the Temple of the Holy Spirit

Paul reminds believers that their bodies belong to God. Kenneth Hagin taught that "you cannot honour the Holy Spirit while carelessly dishonouring His temple." What you allow into your body matters. The believer must treat the body as a sacred place, not as something to abuse or neglect.

2. Anything That Dulls Spiritual Sensitivity is Dangerous

Substances that impair judgment, weaken self-control, or create dependency can harm more than your health. Watchman Nee emphasised that "anything that strengthens the flesh against the spirit becomes a danger to spiritual life." When the mind becomes clouded and the will weakened, spiritual alertness also suffers.

3. Bondage Opens Doors to Further Weakness

Many harmful habits begin small but become controlling. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "whatever masters your body can begin to interfere with your spiritual freedom." The Holy Spirit leads into liberty, purity, and discipline. Anything that enslaves you works against the life of the Spirit.

4. The Believer Must Practice Self-Control

Self-control is not legalism. It is a fruit of spiritual maturity. Charles G. Finney preached strongly on holiness and discipline, because he understood that undisciplined appetites weaken spiritual strength. The believer must learn to say no to anything that destroys peace, weakens clarity, or opposes God's will.

5. Purity Protects Your Fellowship with God

A clean and disciplined life helps preserve spiritual sensitivity. Jack Coe's revival ministry reflected a strong emphasis on surrender and purity before God. When you protect your body, your mind, and your habits, you also help preserve the health of your spiritual life. God wants you free, clear, and available to Him.

CLOSING PRAYER

Daily Confession

The Spirit does not force growth on an unwilling heart. Charles G. Finney often called believers to full surrender because growth depends on yieldedness. Areas you refuse to surrender can become areas of stagnation. But when you say yes to God, the Spirit continues His sanctifying work in you.

5. Growth Produces Visible Fruit

Spiritual growth is inward, but it eventually becomes visible. Jack Coe's ministry showed that a life touched by God becomes evident in both character and power. As you grow, people will see greater peace, wisdom, love, purity, patience, and spiritual authority in your life. Growth is not hidden forever. It bears fruit.

The Light of God

1 JOHN 1:5

4. Walking in the Light Requires Honesty

God does not ask us to pretend. He asks us to walk in the light. Charles G. Finney taught that revival often begins where believers become honest before God. Walking in the light means openness, repentance, and willingness to be corrected. It means refusing hidden compromise and choosing truth.

When believers walk in the light, fellowship with God and with one another grows stronger. Jack Coe often ministered in environments charged with repentance and divine light. The Fruits of the Spirit

GALATIANS 5:22-23

Pursue Love by the Spirit

1 CORINTHIANS 14:1

"Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy."

How Faith is the Currency of the Spirit

HEBREWS 11:6

"And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him."

Faith is one of the most important realities in the life of a believer. In the realm of the Spirit, faith is what gives access to God's promises, God's power, and God's ways. Just as currency is needed to transact in the natural world, faith is necessary to operate in the spiritual realm. Being Raptured and Being Prepared

1 THESSALONIANS 4:16-17

"For the Lord himself will come down from heaven... and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds..."

A prepared believer is one who deals with sin quickly, walks in the light, and desires to be found faithful before God.

4. The Holy Spirit Helps the Believer Stay Awake

Readiness is not achieved by fear or human strain alone. The Holy Spirit keeps the believer spiritually awake. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "intimacy with the Holy Spirit keeps the heart alert and expectant." A prayer-less and careless life makes the believer dull, but fellowship with God keeps the spirit watchful.

5. Hope in Christ's Return Produces Steadfast Living

The truth of the rapture is not meant to make believers passive, but faithful. Jack Coe's generation lived with urgency because they believed eternity was near. When you live prepared, you become serious about prayer, serious about the Word, serious about purity, and serious about winning souls. Hope in His coming should shape the way you live now.

2 THESSALONIANS 2:9-10

"The coming of the lawless one will be in accordance with how Satan works. He will use all sorts of displays of power through signs and wonders that serve the lie..."

One of the dangers of the last days and of the Christian walk is deception. Deception is dangerous because it can look convincing while leading a person away from truth. Not everything that appears spiritual, powerful, or attractive is from God. The spirit of deception operates through lies, confusion, false appearances, false doctrine, and subtle distortion of truth. This is why the believer must stay rooted in God's Word and sensitive to the Holy Spirit.

Understanding the Spirit of Deception

1. Deception Often Appears Close to the Truth

The enemy rarely deceives through what is obviously false alone. He often mixes truth with error. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the most dangerous deception is the one that sounds almost right." This is why believers must grow in discernment. Anything that moves you away from the full truth of God's Word, even subtly, must be tested.

2. Signs and Wonders Alone Are Not Proof of Truth

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How to Counter Spiritual Attacks

EPHESIANS 6:11

"Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes."

Spiritual attacks are a reality in the life of many believers. These attacks may come through fear, confusion, temptation, discouragement, oppression, accusation, or intense resistance. The believer must understand that spiritual attacks are not overcome through panic or fleshly reaction, but through spiritual weapons given by God. Victory comes when the believer stands in Christ, uses the Word, remains prayerful, and refuses to surrender ground to the enemy.

Prayer is not a last resort. It is a weapon. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "prayer connects the believer to divine reinforcement." A praying believer is not helpless. Through prayer, strength is renewed, strategy is received, peace is restored, and the enemy's pressure is resisted. Prayer keeps the spirit from collapsing under attack.

5. Standing Firm in Faith Brings Victory

The enemy often attacks in order to shake confidence in God. Jack Coe preached boldly that believers must not surrender ground to fear. Faith is what keeps you standing when attacks intensify. Even when pressure comes, a believer must remain rooted in Christ, refusing to give the enemy agreement. In Christ, victory is not uncertain. It is already secured.

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When You Are a Victim of Sorcery

ISAIAH 54:17

"No weapon forged against you will prevail..."

There are times when believers may feel oppressed, targeted, or deeply troubled in ways that seem spiritual in nature. Scripture makes it clear that the works of darkness are real, but it also makes it clear that the authority of Jesus Christ is greater. The believer must never respond with fear, panic, or superstition. Instead, they must stand in Christ, reject every work of darkness, remain rooted in God's truth, and seek the covering of prayer, faith, and spiritual support. No power of darkness is greater than the power of God.

Understanding What to Do When You Are a Victim of Sorcery

1. Do Not Let Fear Rule Your Heart

Fear gives darkness too much room in the mind. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the believer's first response must be faith, not fear." If a person believes they are under spiritual attack or influence, fear will only weaken their spiritual posture. The first step is to remember who you are in Christ and refuse to surrender your peace to panic.

2. Christ's Authority is Higher Than Every Work of Darkness

The power of Jesus is above every evil power. Watchman Nee emphasised that "the believer stands in the victory of the cross, not in personal strength." The cross of Christ broke the authority of darkness. The believer must stand on this finished work, not on superstition or human formulas. Jesus is Lord over every spiritual opposition.

3. Prayer and the Word Must Become Your Foundation

A believer facing oppression must remain grounded in Scripture and prayer. Charles G. Finney taught that earnest prayer has power to break spiritual heaviness and opposition. Speaking God's Word, declaring truth, and praying with faith help stabilise the spirit. The Word builds confidence, and prayer invites divine intervention.

4. Do Not Isolate Yourself Spiritually

When spiritual oppression is intense, believers should not remain isolated. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that fellowship and agreement in prayer strengthen the believer in battle. Trusted, mature believers and pastoral support can help bring encouragement, discernment, and prayer. Isolation often makes fear and confusion worse.

Darkness seeks access where there is compromise, fear, and disorder. Jack Coe's revival preaching often called believers into surrender, holiness, and bold trust in God. A clean and yielded life does not make a believer fearful. It makes them confident in God's covering. The believer should reject occult involvement, reject superstition, and stand firmly in the peace of Christ.

Many believers who pray in tongues regularly testify that it strengthens their inner man, sharpens their spiritual sensitivity, deepens their prayer life, and increases their awareness of God's presence. Praying in tongues allows the believer to pray from the spirit. This does not replace understanding, but it adds a deeper dimension to prayer life.

3. Praying in Tongues Increases Spiritual Sensitivity

Believers who regularly pray in tongues often become more aware of God's presence and promptings. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "long seasons of prayer in the Spirit sharpen the inward life." As the spirit becomes more active, the believer often notices increased clarity, greater peace, and stronger sensitivity to the Holy Spirit.

4. It Helps Maintain Spiritual Fire

A neglected prayer life often results in spiritual dryness. Charles G. Finney understood the need for believers to remain spiritually alive and fervent before God. Praying in tongues helps keep the inner life stirred. It helps the believer remain spiritually warm, prayerful, and responsive to God.

5. Praying in Tongues Deepens Fellowship with God

Tongues are not just for power. They are also for communion. Jack Coe's revival world strongly valued the ministry of the Holy Spirit and the believer's deep interaction with God. When you pray in tongues sincerely and regularly, your spiritual walk becomes deeper, more sensitive, and more yielded to the Holy Spirit.

CLOSING PRAYER

Daily Confession

As I pray in the Spirit, my inner man is strengthened and my walk with God grows deeper.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of the Holy Spirit and for the privilege of praying in the Spirit. Strengthen my inner man and deepen my prayer life. Let my spirit become more sensitive to You, and let my walk with You grow stronger each day. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

"IN GRATITUDE AND IN LOVE
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Signs of Idol Worship

EXODUS 20:3

"You shall have no other gods before me."

Idolatry is not only about statues and carved images. At its core, idol worship is anything that takes the place of God in a person's heart. It is when a person gives ultimate devotion, trust, fear, desire, or dependence to something other than the Lord. This is a serious issue because God desires first place in the life of the believer. Idolatry can be subtle, and many people may not recognise it when it has taken root. This is why the believer must examine the heart carefully.

Understanding Signs of Idol Worship

1. An Idol Takes the Place That Belongs to God

Anything that becomes supreme in your heart can become an idol. Kenneth Hagin taught that "whatever controls your devotion can begin to control your life." God alone deserves ultimate loyalty and worship. When something else begins to take His place, the heart starts to drift into idolatry.

2. Excessive Dependence on Created Things is a Warning Sign

Watchman Nee emphasised that the human heart can cling to created things in unhealthy ways. Money, relationships, status, possessions, power, reputation, and even personal ambition can become idols if they become the source of security apart from God. When trust shifts from God to created things, idolatry begins to form.

3. Idolatry Often Shows Up Through Misplaced Fear or Obsession

What a person fears excessively or pursues obsessively can reveal the state of the heart. Charles G. Finney taught that the heart always reveals its true object of love. If a person is more controlled by the loss of something than by the fear of grieving God, that may expose an idol.

4. Idolatry Can Hide Behind Religion

A person may appear religious and still have idols in the heart. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "outward forms do not replace inward surrender." Sometimes people trust in methods, personalities, titles, or traditions more than in God Himself. This is why sincere self-examination is necessary before the Lord.

5. True Worship Restores God to His Rightful Place

The answer to idolatry is not mere outward removal, but inward surrender. Jack Coe preached with urgency about wholehearted devotion to God. When the heart truly returns to the Lord, idols lose their hold. Worship, repentance, obedience, and love for God restore the believer to right alignment. God must not only be part of your life. He must be first.

CLOSING PRAYER

Daily Confession

God alone is first in my life, and my heart belongs fully to Him.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, search my heart and reveal anything that has taken Your place within me. Remove every idol, every unhealthy attachment, and every false source of trust. Teach me to worship You in spirit and in truth, and let my heart remain fully devoted to You alone. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

IN GRATITUDE AND IN LOVE
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Being a Partaker in His Divine Nature

2 PETER 1:4

"Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature..."

One of the most powerful truths in the Christian life is that the believer is not only forgiven but transformed. Through Christ, we are made partakers of His divine nature. This does not mean we become God, but it means that His life, His character, and His nature are imparted into our spirit. Many believers live far below what God has made available because they are not aware of this reality. To partake of His divine nature is to live beyond corruption, beyond limitation, and to reflect the life of Christ.

Understanding Being a Partaker in His Divine Nature

1. Divine Nature is Given Through Christ

This nature is not earned; it is received. Kenneth Hagin taught that "when you are born again, you receive the nature of God in your spirit." This means that righteousness, holiness, and spiritual life are placed within you. The believer must learn to live from this reality, not from their past identity.

2. The New Nature Separates You from Corruption

Peter teaches that this nature helps us escape the corruption in the world. Watchman Nee explained that "the life of God within us opposes the old nature of sin." The more you yield to this divine nature, the more sin loses its hold over you.

3. God's Promises Activate This Nature

The Word of God helps bring this nature into expression. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "when you believe and act on God's promises, divine life begins to manifest." The promises of God are not only comforting, they are activating.

4. This Nature Must Be Developed

Though it is given instantly, it must grow. Charles G. Finney emphasised that believers must cooperate with God's work within them. Growth happens through obedience, the Word, prayer, and surrender.

5. Living in This Nature Reflects Christ

A believer walking in divine nature will begin to reflect Christ in character and action. Jack Coe's ministry showed that divine life produces visible transformation. You are not meant to remain natural. You are called to live supernaturally.

CLOSING PRAYER

Daily Confession

I am a partaker of God's divine nature, and His life is working in me daily.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, thank You for making me a partaker of Your divine nature. Help me to live according to this new life within me. Let Your character be revealed through me, and let me walk in holiness and strength. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

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Overcoming Fear and Anxiety

2 TIMOTHY 1:7

"For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind."

Fear and anxiety are some of the most common battles believers face. They can weaken faith, cloud judgment, and rob a person of peace. However, Scripture makes it clear that fear is not from God. The believer has been given power, love, and a sound mind through the Holy Spirit. Overcoming fear is not about pretending problems do not exist, but about trusting God above circumstances and allowing His Spirit to govern your heart.

Understanding Overcoming Fear and Anxiety

1. Fear Does Not Come from God

Fear is not part of God's nature. Kenneth Hagin taught that "fear and faith cannot operate together." When fear enters, faith weakens. The believer must recognise fear as something to resist, not something to accept.

2. The Spirit Gives Power Over Fear

God has given us power. Watchman Nee emphasised that "the spirit of man, when strengthened, can overcome emotional instability." The Holy Spirit strengthens your inner man so you are not ruled by fear.

3. Love Drives Out Fear

Anxiety often comes through uncontrolled thoughts. Charles G. Finney stressed the importance of disciplined thinking. The believer must learn to reject fearful thoughts and replace them with God's truth.

5. Trusting God Brings Peace

Peace comes when trust replaces worry. Jack Coe ministered bold faith even in intense situations. Trusting God does not remove challenges instantly, but it removes the control those challenges have over your heart.

I reject fear and anxiety, and I walk in the power, love, and sound mind given to me by God.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, thank You that fear does not come from You. Help me to trust You completely and to walk in peace. Remove anxiety from my heart and strengthen my mind with Your truth. Let Your Spirit fill me with confidence and rest. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

The Supernatural Power of the Spirit Man

EPHESIANS 3:16

"That he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being."

Many Christians struggle because they rely too much on physical ability and human reasoning, while neglecting the strength of the inner man. When the spirit man is strengthened, the believer begins to walk in power, endurance, authority, and divine ability.

Real strength comes from within. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the spirit of man carries the life and power of God." When the spirit is strong, the believer can stand firm even under pressure.

He leads from within, through the human spirit. Learning to be led by the Spirit is essential for making right decisions, avoiding unnecessary struggles, and walking in alignment with God's will.

Understanding Being Led by the Spirit

1. God Leads His Children from Within

The Holy Spirit dwells in the believer and leads from the inside. Kenneth Hagin taught that "the inward witness is the primary way God leads His children." This means guidance often comes as a quiet knowing, a sense of peace, or a check within your spirit. When you are moving in the wrong direction, the Holy Spirit may create unrest or hesitation. Learning to recognise these inner signals is key to being led accurately.

4. Obedience Sharpens Spiritual Sensitivity

The more you obey the Spirit, the clearer His voice becomes. Charles G. Finney taught that "obedience increases spiritual clarity." When believers ignore the Spirit repeatedly, sensitivity becomes dull. But when they respond quickly and sincerely, their ability to hear God improves.

5. A Life of Fellowship Strengthens Guidance

The closer you are to God, the easier it is to recognise His leading. Jack Coe's ministry demonstrated that those who walk closely with God often move with confidence and accuracy. Time in prayer, the Word, and worship keeps your spirit aligned and receptive.

JAMES 3:17

"But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere."

There are two types of wisdom that operate in the life of man: earthly wisdom and wisdom from above. Earthly wisdom is driven by human reasoning, self-interest, and limited understanding. But wisdom from above comes from God. It is pure, peaceful, and full of life. The believer must learn to depend on divine wisdom rather than natural understanding, because God sees beyond what man can see.

Understanding Wisdom from Above

1. Divine Wisdom Comes from God Alone

True wisdom is not produced by intellect alone. Kenneth Hagin taught that "God's wisdom sees the end from the beginning." This means divine wisdom enables the believer to make decisions that align with God's purpose, even when natural logic suggests otherwise.

2. Heavenly Wisdom is Pure and Peaceful

James describes wisdom from above as pure and peace-loving. Watchman Nee explained that "what comes from God carries purity and inner peace." If something produces confusion, strife, or compromise, it is likely not from God. His wisdom brings clarity and calm assurance.

3. Wisdom is Given Through the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the source of divine understanding. Dr Yonggi Cho taught that "the Spirit reveals what the natural mind cannot perceive." When you depend on Him, you receive insight that goes beyond experience or education.

4. Humility Positions You to Receive Wisdom

Pride blocks wisdom. Charles G. Finney emphasised that a humble heart is open to correction and learning. God gives wisdom to those who are willing to acknowledge their need for Him and seek His direction sincerely.

5. Divine Wisdom Produces Good Fruit

Wisdom from God leads to right actions and good results. Jack Coe's ministry showed that when decisions are guided by God, they carry power and impact. True wisdom does not only sound good. It produces results that reflect God's nature.

CLOSING PRAYER

Daily Confession

I receive wisdom from above, and my decisions are guided by the Spirit of God.

Prayer

GALATIANS 5:24

Crucifying the flesh is not a one-time event, but a continuous process of surrendering to God and refusing to allow sinful desires to dominate. This is essential for spiritual growth and for walking in the Spirit.

Understanding Crucifying the Flesh

1. The Flesh Opposes the Spirit

The flesh and the Spirit are in conflict. Kenneth Hagin taught that "you cannot walk in the flesh and expect spiritual results." The flesh seeks comfort, pleasure, and self-rule, while the Spirit leads toward righteousness and obedience.

2. Crucifixion Means Denial of Self-Will

Jack Coe's ministry was marked by prayer and dependence on God. A believer who prays consistently experiences both intimacy with God and spiritual authority. Prayer deepens relationship and releases power.
