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DAY TRIPS FROM SEVILLE:

Seville's central location makes it an ideal starting point for exploring some of Andalusia's most stunning destinations. Whether you want to delve into rich history, breathtaking landscapes, or taste exquisite local delicacies, these day trips offer something for everyone.

1.- Córdoba

Getting There: High-speed AVE trains from Seville to Córdoba take about 45 minutes. You can also drive, which takes approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes.

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Mezquita-Catedral:** One of the world's most unique architectural wonders, combining Islamic and Christian elements. Take time to walk through its iconic forest of arches and columns.
- **Alcázar de los Reyes Cristianos:** A historical palace with beautiful gardens and stunning views from its towers. The peaceful garden walk is a must.
- **Jewish Quarter:** Stroll through this labyrinth of narrow streets and whitewashed houses. Don't miss the historic *Calleja de las Flores*, a beautiful alley full of flowers.
- **Roman Bridge:** A picturesque spot, especially at sunset, offering fantastic city skyline views.

Tip: Buy tickets for the Mezquita in advance to skip the line, and visit early in the morning to avoid crowds.

2.- Cádiz

Getting There: Take a direct train from Seville (about 1 hour 45 minutes) or drive (1 hour 30 minutes).

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **La Caleta Beach:** Relax on Cádiz's famous city beach, known for its golden sand and beautiful sunsets. It's a perfect place to cool off after exploring the city.
- **Cathedral de Cádiz:** Visit the city's iconic cathedral and climb the Torre de Poniente for panoramic views of Cádiz and the Atlantic Ocean.
- **Tavira Tower:** The highest point in Cádiz, this tower offers a 360-degree view of the city. Don't miss the camera obscura experience, which gives a live projection of the city in real-time.
- **Mercado Central:** The oldest covered market in Spain, it's the perfect spot to grab some fresh seafood or traditional tapas like *tortillitas de camarones*.

Tip: Visit during spring or fall for cooler temperatures, and take a guided tour of the city to learn more about its fascinating history.

3.- Ronda

Getting There: You can drive (1 hour 45 minutes) or take a bus (about 2 hours). There are no direct trains from Seville to Ronda.

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Puente Nuevo:** This iconic bridge offers stunning views of the deep gorge below. You can hike down the gorge for a different perspective.
- **Plaza de Toros:** Ronda is home to one of Spain's oldest bullrings. Even if you're not interested in bullfighting, the museum and architecture are worth a visit.
- **Jardines de Cuenca:** These terraced gardens offer a beautiful view of the Tajo Gorge and the Puente Nuevo.
- **Casa del Rey Moro:** A palace with a secret stairway carved into the cliff that leads down to the river at the bottom of the gorge.

Tip: Visit during spring or fall for cooler temperatures, and take a guided tour of the city to learn more about its fascinating history.

4.- Jerez de la Frontera

Getting There: You can drive (1 hour), or take a train from Seville (about 1 hour 15 minutes).

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Sherry Bodegas:** Jerez is famous for its sherry wine production. Take a tour at one of the renowned bodegas, such as *González Byass* or *Bodegas Tradición*, to learn about the sherry-making process and enjoy tastings.
- **Real Escuela Andaluza del Arte Ecuestre:** Watch the impressive equestrian shows featuring Andalusian horses, renowned for their beauty and agility.
- **Alcázar of Jerez:** A Moorish fortress with gardens and a beautiful mosque-turned-chapel. Explore its baths and olive oil mills.
- **Plaza del Arenal:** The city's main square, a lovely spot to relax with a coffee after sightseeing.

Tip: If you plan to visit a bodega, make reservations in advance, especially during the summer months.

5.- Doñana National Park

Getting There: Drive to the park's visitor center (about 1 hour 15 minutes), or take a guided tour from Seville.

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Wildlife Watching:** Doñana is a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its rich biodiversity. Keep an eye out for flamingos, deer, and the rare Iberian lynx.
- **El Rocío Village:** A charming, sandy village with a strong cowboy vibe. It's known for its annual pilgrimage and beautiful white church, *Ermita del Rocío*.
- **Dune Hikes:** Explore the vast shifting sand dunes and marshes on foot or by guided 4x4 tours.
- **Bird Watching at the Marshlands:** The park is a paradise for birdwatchers, especially during migration periods.

Tip: If you plan to visit a bodega, make reservations in advance, especially during the summer months.

6.- Carmona

Getting There: A quick 30-minute drive from Seville, or you can take a bus from the Prado de San Sebastián bus station.

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Roman Necropolis:** Visit this ancient cemetery where you can explore tombs that date back to the 1st century AD. It's a hidden gem for history lovers.
- **Alcázar del Rey Don Pedro:** This impressive fortress offers stunning views of the countryside and the town of Carmona.
- **Santa María Church:** This 15th-century Gothic church is built on the site of an old mosque and boasts beautiful Mudéjar features.
- **Puerta de Sevilla:** This ancient city gate is part of the original Roman walls and provides great town views.

Tip: If you plan to visit a bodega, make reservations in advance, especially during the summer months.

7.- Itálica

Getting There: Located just 20 minutes from Seville, you can reach Itálica by car or bus (from Plaza de Armas station).

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Amphitheater:** Explore the third-largest Roman amphitheater in the world, capable of holding up to 25,000 spectators. It's also famous for being a filming location for *Game of Thrones*.
- **Mosaics:** Wander through the ruins to find beautiful, well-preserved floor mosaics depicting Roman gods and mythical creatures.
- **Thermal Baths and Roman Villas:** Don't miss the thermal baths and the remains of the luxurious Roman villas, which offer a glimpse into daily life in ancient Itálica.

Tip: Visit early in the day to avoid the heat, and bring plenty of water as there's limited shade on site.

8.- Aracena

Getting There: A 1.5-hour drive from Seville, Aracena is located in the Sierra de Aracena mountain range.

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Gruta de las Maravillas:** This stunning cave system is filled with crystal-clear lakes and impressive stalactites and stalagmites. A guided tour takes you through the caverns.
- **Iberian Ham Route:** Aracena is famous for its Iberian ham. Visit local farms and curing houses to see how the famous jamón ibérico is made.
- **Castillo de Aracena:** A Moorish castle sitting atop the hill provides spectacular views of the town and surrounding countryside.

Tip: Combine your visit to Aracena with a stop at a local restaurant to try some of the region's famous Iberian ham.

9.- Osuna

Getting There: It's about a 1-hour drive from Seville, or you can take a train (1 hour 15 minutes).

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Collegiate Church of Osuna:** This Renaissance-style church is home to important artworks and has a crypt, worth exploring.
- **Osuna Archaeological Museum:** Discover the town's rich history since Roman times.
- **Plaza Mayor:** Stroll around this beautiful square and enjoy a coffee at one of its outdoor cafes.
- **Game of Thrones Filming Locations:** Visit the *Osuna Bullring*, which was used as a filming location for the famous TV show.

Tip: Visit Osuna in the spring or fall when temperatures are cooler, making it more enjoyable to explore on foot.

10.- Sanlúcar de Barrameda

Getting There: A 1-hour drive from Seville, or you can take a bus from the Prado de San Sebastián station in Seville.

Must-Do & Must-See:

- **Doñana National Park:** Sanlúcar is a gateway to Doñana National Park, one of Spain's most important natural reserves. Take a guided boat trip across the Guadalquivir River to explore the park's unique ecosystems and wildlife.

- **Bajo de Guía:** This charming riverside district is renowned for its seafood restaurants. You must try the famous *Langostinos de Sanlúcar* (Sanlúcar king prawns), paired with a local glass of *Manzanilla* sherry.

- **Castillo de Santiago:** Explore this 15th-century fortress, perched on a hill with panoramic views of the town and the mouth of the Guadalquivir River.

- **Palacio de los Duques de Medina Sidonia:** This historical palace offers insight into Sanlúcar's aristocratic past, with its beautiful gardens and exhibitions.

- **Playa de la Calzada:** Relax on this long stretch of sandy beach, which also serves as the location for the famous *Sanlúcar Horse Races* that take place in August, a unique spectacle where horses race along the shore at sunset.

Tip: Visit Sanlúcar during the *Feria de la Manzanilla* in May or June, when the town comes alive with celebrations, traditional dress, music, and, of course, plenty of *Manzanilla* sherry.

Whether by train, bus, or car, you'll be set for an unforgettable adventure. Explore Roman ruins, picturesque villages, and stunning coastlines—all within a day's reach.
