A WORD FROM THE FOUNDER

OUAHID ABASSI

Dear donors, partners and members,

The year 2024 marks a symbolic and foundational milestone in the history of our organization: the 10th anniversary of DIGNITÉ International. A decade of humanitarian commitment to serving the most vulnerable, of active solidarity beyond borders, and of constant struggle to uphold an essential value: human dignity.

Founded in 2014, our organization was built in the field, in contact with the harshest realities. It grew with emergencies, developed amid complex crises, and matured in line with the ethical, operational, and human requirements that underpin all genuine solidarity action. In 2024, DIGNITÉ International reached a new milestone, both operationally and organizationally, by responding to growing needs in a profoundly changing and more unstable world, but also by laying a solid foundation for the future.

ENHANCED HUMAN RESOURCES, RENEWED AMBITION

To support its business growth, management has supported its operational team with a strategic strengthening of our human resources, with new hires at headquarters and in the countries where we operate.

Another key milestone was the complete acquisition of our headquarters building in Villenoy, which began in 2022 and was finalized in 2024. DIGNITÉ International thus became the sole owner of its workplace, consolidating its institutional roots and sustainably improving the working conditions of its teams.

AN EXPANSION OF MISSIONS AT THE INTERNATIONAL LEVEL

The year 2024 saw the intensification of our missions around the world, on the occasion of our tenth anniversary.

Our interventions have aimed to respond to acute crisis, but also to lay sustainable foundations in the key areas of health, water, food security, education, and protection.

HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN PALESTINE

Faced with the dramatic worsening of the situation in Gaza, we launched the «Peace and Dignity for Gaza» program in partnership with local actors. Three health centers were set up, providing more than 10,000 consultations per month, with additional food and drinking water distribution initiative.

SUDANESE REFUGEES IN CHAD

The massive influx of refugees from Darfur required immediate mobilization. We strengthened our presence in the Milé 2 and Tiné camps through an operational base in Guéréda. Interventions covered health, water, and food security. A solid partnership was established with CNARR and UNHCR to effectively meet the vital needs of Sudanese refugees.

ACCESS TO WATER AND FOOD AID

We have carried out massive campaigns :

- 5,141 boreholes drilled in five countries in Africa
- and Asia, improving access to drinking water for thousands of families.
- Nearly 4.8 million meals distributed, reaching

15 countries, as part of two major annual food aid campaigns.

HEALTH AND EDUCATION

- In N'Djamena, we opened two new school levels in our socio-educational complex, improving access to secondary education.
- The DIGNITÉ International health center, which took several years to build, opened in early 2024.

OPENING OF NEW FIELD OFFICES

Two new offices were opened this year in Algeria and Benin.

These locations reinforce our longstanding presence in Chad, where we have been operating since 2014.

STRENGTHENED SOCIAL ACTION IN FRANCE

For the first time since its creation, DIGNITÉ International has established a Social Action Department in France, in response to the growing needs related to precarity in our country.

This decision marks a major development, the result of an observation: poverty, isolation, and social distress now affect millions of people in France.

The flagship project of this strategy was the opening of our first pilot solidarity grocery store in Meaux (Seine-et-Marne). Designed as a tool for autonomy and dignity for beneficiaries, this structure is part of a five-year national social strategy aimed at sustainably strengthening local solidarity.

In addition, we carried out an emergency intervention in Mayotte in response to the disaster caused by Cyclone Chido. This quick deployment demonstrated our capacity for action on national territory in a context of real humanitarian crisis.

EXCEPTIONAL FINANCIAL MOBILIZATION

The 2024 financial year saw record fundraising, with over €13 million collected, representing a 31% increase compared to 2023.

This result reflects the exemplary mobilization of our teams and the commitment of our donors, but also their confidence in the rigor of our management, the relevance of our missions and the strength of our commitment.

This fundraising was mainly driven by responses

to the crises in Palestine and Sudan, but also by greater diversification of our campaigns and funding channels.

A REAFFIRMED COMMITMENT IN THE FACE OF WORLDWIDE DRIFT

Finally, in 2024, our humanitarian organization continued its fight for universal values, in an increasingly worrying global context:

- The rise of extremism, hate speech, and stigmatization of minorities threaten social peace and unity in our societies.
- Armed conflicts are multiplying, fueling instability and despair.
- The collapse of international humanitarian law.
- Climate change increases the vulnerability of the poorest populations.

In this context, DIGNITÉ International reaffirms its unwavering commitment to human dignity, world peace, freedom of conscience, social justice, and international solidarity

Our responsibility is immense. In this anniversary year, we are not only looking back at how far we have come, we are also preparing for the future. We know that the challenges are tremendous, but we are tackling them with determination, clarity, and fidelity to our founding principles... More than ever, human dignity remains our compass, our horizon, and our common struggle.

I would like to extend my warmest thanks to all the volunteers, employees, partners, and donors who have made this year one of action, growth, and hope.

DIGNITÉ INTERNATIONAL WHO ARE WE ?

DIGNITÉ International is a non-governmental organization dedicated to international solidarity, with a social and humanitarian mission.

Since 2014, we have been working in more than 20 countries in France and around the world to uphold a fundamental principle: every human being has the right to dignity, regardless of their origins, gender, beliefs, or the circumstances they face.

We take action wherever life and human dignity are threatened, whether by conflict, natural disasters, poverty, or exclusion.

On the ground, we provide vital assistance, long-term support, and sustain local initiatives that enable communities to recover. Because dignity lies not in receiving, but in the ability to act for oneself, empowerment and resilience building are at the heart of our commitment.

OUR CORE PRINCIPLES

DIGNITÉ International's work is based on four universal humanitarian principles, which guarantee our commitment, credibility, and neutrality in the field:

Humanity : Preserving life and dignity, improving the human condition, and promoting respect for the fundamental rights of every individual.

Impartiality : Providing assistance without any distinction based on origin, gender, religion, social status, or political affiliation. Our priority is guided solely by the urgency of the needs.

Neutrality : Adopting a neutral position towards any conflict or controversy of a political, religious, racial, or ideological nature, in order to guarantee acceptance and humanitarian access.

Independence : Acting autonomously, free from outside influence, while respecting the laws, cultures, and local contexts in which we operate.





OUR MISSION

Our mission is to preserve life, alleviate suffering, and defend human dignity in the most challenging contexts.

Whether responding to a humanitarian emergency or working on long-term development, we mobilize our resources, teams, and partners to help the most vulnerable people, without distinction.

OUR AREAS OF EXPERTISE

WATER, HYGIENE AND SANITATION

We take action to ensure access to safe drinking water and sanitation services in contexts where these vital resources are lacking.

Our actions also include efforts to raise awareness of public health issues related to hygiene and the environment.



HEALTH, NUTRITION AND PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT

DIGNITÉ International strengthens public health systems and works to ensure equitable access to physical and mental health care for the most vulnerable populations.

Our interventions focus on emergency response, prevention, medical care, and the fight against malnutrition, with particular attention to the needs of children and women.



SOLIDARITY-BASED ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND EMPOWERMENT

DIGNITÉ International is committed to empowering communities economically by supporting income-generating activities.

Our actions are based on personalized support tailored to the needs and circumstances of each community, as well as capacity building, in order to promote sustainable livelihoods and greater resilience in the face of economic, social, and climate crises.





FOOD AID AND SECURITY

In situations of crisis or extreme poverty, we implement emergency food responses while promoting sustainable approaches to strengthen beneficiary's food security.



SUPPORT FOR DISPLACED PERSONS AND REFUGEES

We support displaced populations by meeting their basic needs and promoting their integration, while protecting their dignity in host communities.

A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

AMIN ALAIN TROUVÉ-BAGHDOUCHE

2024 is a pivotal year for DIGNITÉ International (DI), marked among other things by international recognition, symbolized by the introduction of a memorandum with the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) on the refugee crisis in Sudan, in eastern Chad.

It was a year marked by relentless massacres of the civilian population in Gaza, where our work continued unabated thanks to the courage of our operational teams on the ground. We were also able to provide assistance to Lebanese victims of the bombings, as well as to Syrian refugee families in camps in Lebanon.

DI's work is not limited to humanitarian emergencies, and we have continued our development activities in various countries and contexts. In Chad, Benin, Madagascar, Pakistan, Cambodia, and elsewhere, we have continually expanded the scope of our programs by strengthening our national operational teams.

In the medical field, we have: continued our projects to build or renovate health centers in priority areas, including vaccination and childbirth care; reinforced our approach to mental health; implemented programs to combat child malnutrition, etc.

Access to water and sanitation remains a major humanitarian issue worldwide in terms of hygiene and health. This year, we have once again affirmed our commitment to helping communities through projects involving the drilling of water sources and wells and the construction of water towers.

Food aid, the vehicle for our action, will once again this year help thousands of people to

preserve their basic dignity... In this context, projects to promote food self-sufficiency among populations have been set up, such as African farms...

All of these programs are combined with **education and child welfare** (including care for orphans), which by their very nature involve mothers, women, and a community-based approach.

This is a year that commits the Department of International Programs and Operations (DIPO) to humanitarian action which, sadly, given the current state of the world, shows no sign of slowing down or even narrowing in scope—quite the contrary, in fact.

It is in this uncertain international context for a large part of humanity that **we are continuing our operations, strengthening our actions with the aim of becoming ever more involved where we can be most effective**, with respect for human dignity as our guiding principle.

PEACE AND DIGNITY FOR GAZA



In May 2024, DIGNITÉ International launched the "Peace and Dignity for Gaza" initiative to address the physical and psychological trauma of the Gazan population.

In order to provide the most comprehensive and appropriate response to a wide range of needs, DI has decided to work together with other organizations.

It is therefore carrying out this project in partnership with two Palestinian NGOs:

- NSR (National Society for Rehabilitation)
- PAEEP (Palestine Association for Education and Environmental Protection)

and a French NGO, Terra Psy Psychologues Sans Frontières, with the participation and support of PMRS (Palestinian Medical Relief Society).



PEACE & DIGNITY 4 GAZA



The project « Peace and Dignity for Gaza » led to the creation of three bases in the Gaza Strip:

- **Gaza City** : main city in the northern Gaza Strip, where needs are the greatest
- **Deir Al Balah** : area where many displaced persons took refuge following the evacuation of Rafah in May 2024
- **Khan Younes** : area frequently targeted by bombing

PEACE AND DIGNITY FOR GAZA

ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE

The consortium's three operational bases are each physically represented by a medical center. Within these centers, more than 10,000 people receive medical, psychological, nutritional, and/or material care tailored to their needs every month. In order to treat people who are unable to travel to the center, a mobile medical team is also deployed in each area.

THE IMPACT OF OUR HEALTHCENTERS IN 2024

- **73 922** patients treated, including 31 554 children
- **52** doctors and healthcare professionals working in the centers (general practitioners or specialists, nurses, psychologists, physical therapists, ...)
- **47 685** medical consultations (general and specialized medicine : pediatrics, neurology, cardiology, gynecology, ...)
- **8 213** physiotherapy (or physical therapy) sessions
- **4 043** individual therapy sessions and 96 group therapy session
- **10 888** nursing care sessions
- **3 086** children vaccinated against polio, in collaboration with UNICEF, WHO and UNRWA

Other notable actions carried out by health centers in 2024 include: two breast cancer screening campaigns, a blood donation campaign, and the treatment of nearly 1,000 children suffering from malnutrition.

The project Peace and Dignity for Gaza, initiated by DIGNITÉ International, enabled the distribution of 40 080 traditional breads in 2024.

These constitute a cash-for-work activity for the women who make them, and they are then distributed to people in camps for displaced persons.



3 575

Boxes of powdered milk were distributed to children in Gaza, including 1,575 directly at health centers.

From October 2024 to January 2025, the Peace and Dignity for Gaza project supported a camp for displaced women by ensuring their access to water and food. During these four months, 234 families benefited from this support, which consisted of :

- **One food parcel per month**, containing fruits, vegetables, meat and essential goods,
- **A bag of bread** every day,
- **50 liters of drinking water**, 5 days per week.

In total, the project enabled the distribution of **936 food parcels, 28,028 bags of bread, and 936,000 liters of drinking water.**

Hot meals were distributed thanks to the operation 1€ = 1 meal conducted by DIGNITY International during the month of Ramadan and the Eid holidays in Gaza City, Rafah, and Al Mawasi.



Before the Rafah crossing was closed following the offensive in May 2024, DIGNITÉ International took part in the humanitarian convoy organized from Egypt in April.

This enabled it to transport a truck carrying 1,320 food parcels, which were then distributed to the people of Gaza.

A second truck carrying food aid was also scheduled to be sent.

However, this was prevented by the closure of the border between Egypt and the Gaza Strip. The remaining 1,320 food parcels were therefore distributed to Palestinian refugee families in Cairo.

ACCESS TO WATER

In 2024, faced with the worsening humanitarian crisis in the Gaza Strip, DIGNITÉ International stepped up its efforts to respond to the vital emergency linked to access to drinking water, particularly in the city of Deir Al Balah, one of the hardest-hit areas.

A total of **1 636 000 liters of drinking water were transported by tanker trucks** and distributed directly to displaced families living in precarious conditions, often without access to a functioning water network. This essential aid met the daily needs of thousands of people, particularly children, women, and the elderly, for whom clean water is a matter of survival.

In a context marked by the collapse of infrastructure and the contamination of numerous water sources, this massive distribution helped prevent waterborne diseases, maintain minimum sanitary conditions, and provide relief to a section of the population that was completely cut off from any aid.

SUDANESE REFUGEES EMERGENCY

HUMANITARIAN CONTEXT

THE WORLD'S WORST DISPLACEMENT CRISIS

The Sudanese crisis is considered by the UN to be the worst displacement crisis in the world. To date, more than 12 million people have been forced to flee their homes, including 8.7 million internally displaced persons and approximately 3.5 million refugees, according to the UN.

Chad, which was already hosting thousands of Sudanese who had fled previous crises, now has more than 1 million Sudanese refugees on its soil. (1,115,413 as of January 19, 2025, source: UNHCR)

Chad is facing an unprecedented humanitarian crisis, with a massive influx of Sudanese refugees in critical conditions. The strain on infrastructure, access to essential services, health security, and the protection of vulnerable populations require a coordinated and strengthened international response.


INTERVENTION STRATEGY IN 2024

Given the scale of the crisis, DIGNITÉ International has implemented a targeted humanitarian strategy coordinated with the UNHCR (United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees), focusing on two key refugee camps in eastern Chad:

- **Milé 2** : a new camp developed as an extension of the existing Milé camp,
- **Tiné** : transit camp at the border welcoming new arrivals.

This approach allows for immediate assistance as soon as refugees arrive at the transit camp, followed by more structured and sustainable support in the reception camp.

An operational coordination base has also been set up in Guéréda, facilitating logistics, multisectoral planning, and liaison between the various humanitarian actors in the field.

SANITATION

Construction of latrines to reinforce hygiene and limit health risks in the camps.



HEALTH

- Construction of the Milé 2 health center, adapted to the growing needs of the population.
- Rehabilitation of the Tiné health center, to ensure rapid emergency care for refugees upon arrival.
- Two eye examination and cataract surgery campaigns in Guéréda and Adré for Sudanese refugees and host populations.



FOOD AID

Organization of regular food distribution operations. In 2024, 15 000 Sudanese refugees benefited from this aid.



ACCESS TO DRINKING WATER

Installation of two drinking water supply systems, covering the daily needs of the populations in both camps.

OUTLOOK FOR 2025

In 2025, DIGNITÉ International aims to extend the intervention strategy implemented in 2024, focusing on several areas :

TERRITORIAL REINFORCEMENT :

Opening of two representative offices in Iriba and Abéché, enabling closer coordination with other institutional, state, and humanitarian actors present in the area, close monitoring of projects, and improved responsiveness in the event of a crisis.



FINALIZATION AND CONSOLIDATION OF ACTIONS UNDERTAKEN IN 2024 IN THE MILÉ 2 AND TINÉ CAMPS :

- Completion of infrastructure works (health centers, drinking water supply systems, latrines),
- Effective commissioning of completed drilling operations,
- Deployment of medical and technical personnel, with a particular focus on strengthening local human resources and continuing education,
- Stabilization of maintenance, logistics, and community monitoring systems in both camps.

LAUNCH OF THE GREEN CAMP PILOT PROJECT IN MILÉ 2 : This innovative project aims to make Milé 2 a model of an eco-friendly refugee camp, based on sustainable practices and responsible resource management. The objective is twofold: to improve the living conditions of refugees while reducing the camp's environmental footprint. The project is based on three key components:

1

Tree planting and wood resource management.



2

Creation of a workshop for manufacturing stabilized adobe thermal bricks, enabling the construction of more sustainable housing adapted to the local climate.



3

Installation of family composting dry toilets (TAC), promoting ecological sanitation and the recovery of organic waste.



This project is fully in line with DIGNITÉ International's commitment to combining social innovation, ecological transition, and humanitarian resilience.



LEBANON EMERGENCY

Following the bombings that struck Lebanon at the end of 2024, DIGNITÉ International distributed emergency aid consisting of food, hygiene products, water, shelter kits, and baby products to 5,500 affected Lebanese families.

In December, DI also distributed cold weather kits (food parcels, fuel, blankets, and warm clothing) to 3,700 families.





EMERGENCIES

SYRIA EMERGENCY

In December 2024, DIGNITÉ International organized emergency aid for Syrian families in Al Qusair. 100 pillows, blankets, and bags of bread were distributed there.

DI plans to extend this operation in 2025 with a convoy to assist Syrian refugee families in Lebanon with their return to their country of origin and a project to rehabilitate homes.





DRILLINGS

BENIN - CAMBODIA - NIGER - PAKISTAN - CHAD

Since **2016**, DIGNITÉ International has been committed to fighting for the right of access to drinking water **for all**. In 2024, we were able to drill **5,141 wells** in five countries in Asia and Africa, providing access to safe water for **286,300 people**. This water not only protects **their health** but also significantly improves the daily lives of those who benefit from it.



In northeastern Libya, which was severely affected by flooding caused by Storm Daniel, DIGNITÉ International took action to restore access to drinking water, a vital priority for the affected populations.

12 damaged boreholes were fully rehabilitated, giving families safe and sustainable access to clean water again.

This work involved both recommissioning the pumps and securing the infrastructure to ensure continuity of service even in difficult weather conditions. The project was carried out in collaboration with the local community and local contractors, with a focus on safety and quality.

In addition, to strengthen local capacities and ensure long-term maintenance of the facilities, DIGNITÉ International has equipped three municipalities with essential materials: **solar batteries, pumping equipment, and specialized trucks for the maintenance of hydraulic structures.**

SANITATION / COMPOSTING TOILETS (TAC)

BENIN

In Benin, DIGNITÉ International is piloting a sanitation project with a dual social and environmental impact. It is based on the installation of dry family toilets and the creation of a composting system.

This system allows :

- **Raising awareness** among communities about the importance of hygiene and sanitation.
- **Providing equipment** to vulnerable families.
- **Collecting and recycling** organic waste.
- **Creating jobs** related to the production of certified compost.
- **Regenerating soil** through the use of natural compost.

Beneficiaries finally have access to composting toilets, whereas previously they had no decent place to relieve themselves.



Step 1: Awareness & Installation

- Informing and educating families about sanitation issues.
- Installing family dry toilets.
- Providing sawdust to neutralize odors and start composting



Step 2: Collection of excrement

- A collection agent regularly visits equipped households.
- The buckets are collected and transported to the composting center.



Step 3 : Transformation into fertilizer

- Treatment, composting and production of a 100% natural fertilizer.
- Quality control and certification of the compost.



Step 4 : Sale and financing of the project

- Sale of compost to local market gardeners and farmers.
- Generation of revenue to sustain and expand the project (maintenance, new facilities, collector's salaries...).

FOOD AID

FOOD PARCELS (TFU)

CHAD

During the lean season (the period between harvests from May to September, when food reserves run low), DIGNITÉ International distributed 4,500 food parcels in therapeutic feeding centers to families whose children had been hospitalized for acute malnutrition.

The aim of this support was to ensure that the child and his family had access to sufficient food upon his discharge from hospital, in addition to ready-to-use therapeutic foods (RUTF), so that he would not fall back into malnutrition.



ANNUAL FOOD AID CAMPAIGNS

In march 2024, as part of its major annual food aid campaign, DIGNITÉ International distributed 7,979 food parcels, equivalent to 2,872,440 meals, in 15 countries :

AFRICAN FARMS

BENIN - CHAD

Since 2021, DIGNITÉ International has been setting up agroecological farms to effectively combat the consequences of global warming. The project provides support and training in agricultural techniques to beneficiaries.

Families can thus develop healthy and efficient agriculture, ensuring their self-sufficiency, through the implementation of various agricultural activities such as planting

fruit trees, market gardening, composting, food crops, and livestock farming.

Agroecological farms in Africa significantly improve people's living conditions. They create jobs and thus help prevent rural exodus and forced migration.

Ensuring food security: Creation of self-sufficient family farms enabling direct consumption and marketing of surplus produce. Families are supported by agricultural trainers and coordinators throughout the project.

Combating climate change: In connection with the Great Green Wall initiative, farms contribute to soil regeneration, ecosystem revitalization, and local biodiversity.

Limiting forced migration: By promoting self-sufficiency and local stability, the project helps to keep vulnerable rural populations in place and integrates migrants into community farms.

BEEKEEPING

BENIN

The Apiculture project aims to train 50 young people from the Atacora department in the beekeeping profession through a combination of theoretical and practical training over a period of one year. At the end of the training year, the trainees take the national exam to obtain their Professional Qualification Certificate in beekeeping.

In addition, young graduates receive equipment to start their business in the best possible conditions: coveralls, boots, gloves, beehives, and smokers.

This project is intended as a response to the precarious situation of many rural communities and has two main objectives:

- The fight against poverty and unemployment in rural areas and the improvement of living conditions.
- The creation of green jobs and environmental protection.







SCHOOL COMPLEX DIGNITÉ INTERNATIONAL

CHAD

The DIGNITÉ International School Complex (CSDI) works to facilitate access to education for children in the 1st district of the city of N'Djamena.

After opening the primary school in October 2023, the CSDI added two middle school grades for the 2024/2025 school year. 273 children in grades CP1 to 5ème now attend school daily and follow the Chadian curriculum. Of these 273 children, 100 are housed in the complex's orphanage.

In the following years, the school will gradually integrate children from other middle school grades, then high school.





CHILDHOOD AND EDUCATION

SPONSORSHIP FOR ORPHANS

CHAD

In 2024, DIGNITÉ International's sponsorship program in Chad provided support to 470 children (100 of whom were admitted to the DIGNITÉ International orphanage) and gave them access to education, medical care, food, and clothing.

DI's social teams in Chad are responsible for following up with families and ensuring that children have everything they need.

DISABILITY

MOROCCO



The «Maison de l'Intégration» in the village of Dar Atlas is a specialized care center that supports severely disabled children, who are often abandoned by their parents.

Run by a professional team of three nannies, a physical therapist, a nurse, and two doctors, the House provides high-quality medical care, individualized therapeutic support, and enriching education.

The funding also enables the purchase of new medical and rehabilitation equipment and contributes to the development of services to expand capacity and meet the growing needs of this particularly vulnerable population.

Thanks to the financial support provided by DIGNITÉ International, the facility can operate optimally and offer these children a safe, inclusive, and caring environment.

In Chad, DIGNITÉ International launched four campaigns to "combat preventable blindness" in 2024 in Koumra, Kyabé, Guéréda, and Adré.

These campaigns enabled 43,327 patients to receive eye examinations and 1,244 cases of cataracts to be identified and operated on.

MOBILE CLINIC

LIBYA

In areas affected by Hurricane Daniel in 2023, DIGNITÉ International deployed a mobile medical team to provide access to primary healthcare services to people impacted by the floods.



DIALYSIS

MALI

In partnership with Cluster Digital Africa, DIGNITÉ International has set up a water treatment system for hemodialysis in a polyclinic, enabling the use of machines sent by the NGO in 2023. This initiative provides free, high-quality care to the inhabitants of Bamako and patients from across the region.



FISTULA

CHAD

Obstetric fistula is one of the most dangerous injuries that can occur during childbirth. Caused by long and difficult labor without obstetric intervention or cesarean section, it is characterized by a tear between the bladder and the vagina or rectum. In addition to almost systematic infertility, it causes permanent leakage of urine and/or feces through the vagina for the mother.

The latter can lead to serious medical complications that can be fatal (ulcers, infections, etc.). Young women suffering from fistula, whose incontinence caused by the disease is considered impure, are rejected by society. Many of them find

themselves stigmatized and excluded by their own families, which further amplifies their social and psychological vulnerability. Chad is one of the countries most affected, with more than 1,000 new cases each year.

In 2024, DIGNITÉ International launched a campaign to help women suffering from fistulas in Mao, Chad. Twenty-eight women benefited from reconstructive surgery and social and psychological support.

HEALTH CENTER

CHAD

Within the complex in the 1st district of the city of N'Djamena in Chad, one building is specifically dedicated to providing medical care for children and people living in the surrounding neighborhoods.

This Basic Health Center (BHC) opened in early 2024 and provides a maximum range of primary medical care, covering 80% of the Minimum Package of Activities (MPA), with a specific focus on maternal and child care.



The DIGNITÉ International Health Center (CESADI) recorded its first birth on Monday, April 8, 2024, and it was a baby girl named Mouna! She and her mother are doing well.



MEDICAL TENT

CHAD

In October 2024, during the peak malaria season in Chad, DIGNITÉ International set up a medical tent for the 470 children it sponsors.

Among several tests carried out, the children and their mothers benefited from screening and preventive treatment for typhoid fever and malaria.





SOCIAL MISSIONS FRANCE

DJILALI BENABOURA

AN AMBITIOUS SOCIAL STRATEGIC PLAN FOR FRANCE AND THE CREATION OF A DMSF (DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL MISSIONS FOR FRANCE) TO BECOME A WELL KNOWN AND RECOGNIZED SOCIAL ACTOR AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL.

During the last quarter of 2024, the association DIGNITÉ International, faithful to its new social/strategic plan France, 2025-2030, was keen to become operational quickly by organizing the last **Bancoo project** of the year as part of the integration of this new initiative into its missions.

October was a very busy month for this activity, which involved supervising 11 young people (9 girls and 2 boys) referred by the local missions in Melun and Corbeil-Essonnes, working in pairs and groups to prepare a sporting and artistic activity, as well as participating in small construction projects at a primary school in Benin. These young people were fully committed to the project and carried out a range of tasks (repairing the roof of a classroom,

painting pictures with slate and also a soccer tournament for children who are already very talented at their age, punctuated with dancing and singing) amazed the audience, which included local elected officials, members of the DI team, and other local dignitaries and partners. It was a true village celebration, a memory of bright smiles and warm embraces, promising a **future of solidarity and brotherhood**.

Another project was born in the wake of this, **the first solidarity and social grocery store in Meaux, called DIGNITÉ MARKET**, which was inaugurated on December 21, 2024, by the Mayor of Meaux and the President of the Departmental Council, symbolizing **unity and solidarity with families in economic and social difficulty** and coinciding with the end-of-year celebrations. Since then, this service has been welcoming families and individuals referred by social services and organizations, who can benefit for a certain period of time (3 to 6 months) **from a newly**

fitted and equipped kitchen has been provided for cooking/health, economics, anti-waste, and anti-litter workshops.



The aim is to forge social ties between beneficiaries experiencing temporary difficulties by helping them to become more independent through **developing their capacity for action**. DIGNITÉ Market is a real hub of **community life**.



A busy end to the year helping French citizens in need. The day after the grocery store opened, the emergency following **Storm CHIDO in Mayotte** mobilized the entire management team for an intervention thousands of miles away in Mamoudzou, via Reunion Island, to purchase and transport **several tons of food**, water, and other hygiene products, which arrived two weeks later and were distributed to associations and residents by our teams, with the help of local volunteers.

An unforgettable outpouring of **solidarity** and a human experience that will serve as a foundation for **future social and partnership dynamics** in overseas territories.



And also other projects underway in Meaux, Saint Denis, and other cities and regions, such as Marseille, Lille, Strasbourg, and Lyon, which will be launched and become permanent in five years, requiring material and human resources (employees and volunteers), in line with our three **areas of focus in the fields of social emergency, socio-educational and professional integration, and the solidarity economy**.

DIGNITÉ International has a **rightful place in the French social landscape**, fighting poverty and insecurity among families and retirees, and **helping young people to realize their personal and professional goals and build their future**.

SUBURB COOPERATION (BANCOO)

FRANCE - BENIN

As part of its commitment to inclusion and solidarity, DIGNITÉ International launched the Bancoo (Banlieue Coopération) program in 2024, an original initiative combining socio-professional integration in France with international solidarity experience.

This project was designed to support up to 12 young people aged 18 to 25 who had dropped out of school or were unemployed in their journey toward integration. Selected by the Local Missions of Corbeil and Melun, these young people were enrolled in an intensive three-week program, co-financed by DIGNITÉ International and the Accor Invest Group, with the active support of local organizations.

The program took place in two stages: a first week in France, from September 23 to 30, 2024, dedicated to preparation, intercultural training, and group work, followed by an immersion in Benin from October 2 to 12, 2024, where the young people participated in concrete cooperation actions to help local populations.

By adding an international dimension to a path to integration, Bancoo enables participants to develop human and professional skills, strengthen their self-esteem, and give new meaning to their civic engagement. This innovative approach opens up new prospects for the future for these young people in search of guidance, while fostering active solidarity between regions.

MAYOTTE EMERGENCY

Following the devastating passage of Cyclone Chido over Mayotte, DIGNITÉ International launched an emergency operation to help the severely affected populations. The intervention was structured around several logistical and humanitarian aspects:

29 pallets of goods were purchased in Réunion, representing approximately 15 tons of food and essential items;

The foodstuffs delivered included rice, pasta, corn, canned vegetables, sardines, tuna, tomato paste, salt, and milk, covering the basic needs of 1,000 families;

At the same time, a logistics mission was carried out in Kenya to strengthen supplies of basic commodities.

SOLIDARITY GROCERY STORE

DIGNITÉ International, based in Meaux for 10 years, launches DIGNITÉ Market, a solidarity-based social grocery store to combat food insecurity.

It enables families in need to purchase food and hygiene products at 30% of their retail value, while promoting their independence and social integration. The program is based on support from a social worker (budget management, educational workshops, personalized support) and the involvement of volunteers.

Access is via supervised process. The grocery store targets the most vulnerable residents of Meaux (referral, commission, social contract ; living on less than €9 per day) ; and supports around 300 families per year. Its mission: to go beyond welfare, strengthen social ties, and promote education and citizenship.





ADVOCACY AND INNOVATIVE PROJECTS

HERVÉ DUBOIS

In 2024, DIGNITÉ International inaugurated a department dedicated to **institutional relations, advocacy, and innovation** with the aim of strengthening its recognition among private and public actors in international solidarity.

DIGNITÉ International is a rapidly growing NGO and, as such, is involved in priority areas of humanitarian action around the world. Although medium-sized, our NGO must be listed among the professional French and European emergency NGOs.

Our action in 2024 focused on United Nations agencies, notably the **UNHCR, and an initial contract was signed for action in refugee camps in Chad**. In terms of innovation, **the multi-impact TAC** (composting toilet) project marked our entry into the field of family sanitation in rural areas of developing countries (Mali and Benin).

This health-focused project has an impact in terms of health, improved quality of life, and the environment through the production of high-quality organic compost.

The “African Farms” project, led and developed by DI in 2024, is also a **multi-impact innovation** (economic, ecological, migration) that can be replicated in Sahel countries.

Finally, the public speaking competition, organized in October 2024 to mark our organization's 10th anniversary, proved that the solidarity-based and cultural approach of humanitarian **public speaking competitions** can be a **powerful advocacy tool** for defending the causes that DIGNITÉ International fights for on a daily basis.

- Communication campaign and registration (November 2024).
- Receipt of 35 videos from candidates (December 2024).
- Selection of winners by a professional jury (February 2025).

Finalists receive professional guidance, financial support to bring their social impact projects to fruition, and public representation at the French Institute in Cotonou.

This competition embodies a true platform for talent development, expression of ideas, and societal transformation. DIGNITÉ International wishes to use public speaking competitions in different countries as a tool for advocating for important causes.








PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION BY AREA
