

Chosen Gospel Recovery Inc. is a non-profit 501C3 public benefits corporation founded in 2002. Darlene's mission is to promote the wellbeing and economic self-sufficiency of chronically homeless families and individuals through supportive housing, drug abuse recovery, life skills building, creative community outreach and an array of collaborative services. Which are Transitional Programs for Single Women and Families, Recovering Addicts, Those Recovering from Mental and Physical Abuse.

The Chosen Gospel Singing and Recovery Ministry consists of a team of men and women delivered and set free from the bondage of drug and alcohol abuse. Chosen has been inspired to reach out to all communities to provide coordinated special events, share pertinent information, education and resources regarding social and spiritual support for people in active addiction.

Chosen was formed in early 2002 by Darlene Watley with the assistance of Regina Christian. Former members of S.A.D.A.A. (Sistah's Against Drugs and Alcohol Abuse), Darlene and Regina have an extensive background and a broad range of experience.

Some of their major accomplishments and past performances include: The 1998 Mac Donald's Gospel fest winners, The Bobby Jones Gospel fest at Disney land, the Glory awards at West Angeles, and the inspiration of women award. They have performed at the Black business expo, the African market place, the shrine auditorium, the Ebel Theater, the Dorothy Chandler pavilion, for Fox television and numerous Churches, spiritual retreats, recovery homes, domestic violence programs, and group homes though out Los Angeles County.

Darlene, Cookie, Lindsay, Briana, Tami and Debra are inspired to take the message back to the community, our desire is to coordinate special events thus allowing us to engage with drug addicted individuals planting new seeds of hope that they too are children of GOD, and can recover.

Darlene Watley is the Pastor of Faithful Zion First Fruits Ministry located in Los Angeles CA where she is also the Director of Street Ministry.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Amanda Gorman

National Youth Poet Laureate of the United States



Heralded as "the next great figure in American poetry," Amanda Gorman made history in 2017 by being named the first ever National Youth Poet Laureate in the United States of America.

In this role she has spoken at the Library of Congress, the United Nations x Mashable Social Good Summit, WE Day, and venues across the country. As a native of Los Angeles, prior to her national position she served as the inaugural Youth Poet Laureate of L.A. and later the West. In these capacities she met Michelle Obama at the White House, conducted a library tour, and published The One for Whom Food Is Not Enough.

She is Founder and Executive Director of One Pen One Page, which promotes literacy through free creative writing programming for underserved youth. She has been a HERlead Fellow in Washington, D.C, and London, and a UN Youth Delegate in NYC. She's performed alongside Jennifer Aniston, Morgan Freeman, and Lin-Manuel Miranda to advocate for youth leadership and arts education, and spoken alongside Al Gore and Secretary Hillary Clinton for environmentalism and women's rights. Featured in The New York Times, The Today Show, MTV, Teen Vogue, Seventeen Magazine, TIDAL, Essence's Woke 100 list, Time for Kids, Yahoo Style, the Google Assistant, and more, her work has appeared or is forthcoming in The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal. The Washington Post, Glamour Magazine, The Boston Globe. The Huffington Post, and Elle UK. A model on the side, she's been a face in two national campaigns for Eileen Fisher and Helmut Lang. She is a recipient of the Making a Difference Award from Black Girls Rock and BET, recognition from the Scholastic Inc. and YoungArts, a Genius Grant from OZY Media, and a College Women of the Year Award from Glamour Magazine. This fall she was selected from a competitive 20,000+ applicant pool to be one of the newest contributors to the New York Times newsletter The Edit, tailored to college students and recent graduates.

Currently a Harvard junior in the top of her class, she studies Sociology and Spanish. She is running for president in 2036.


