Understanding Your Flooring Type

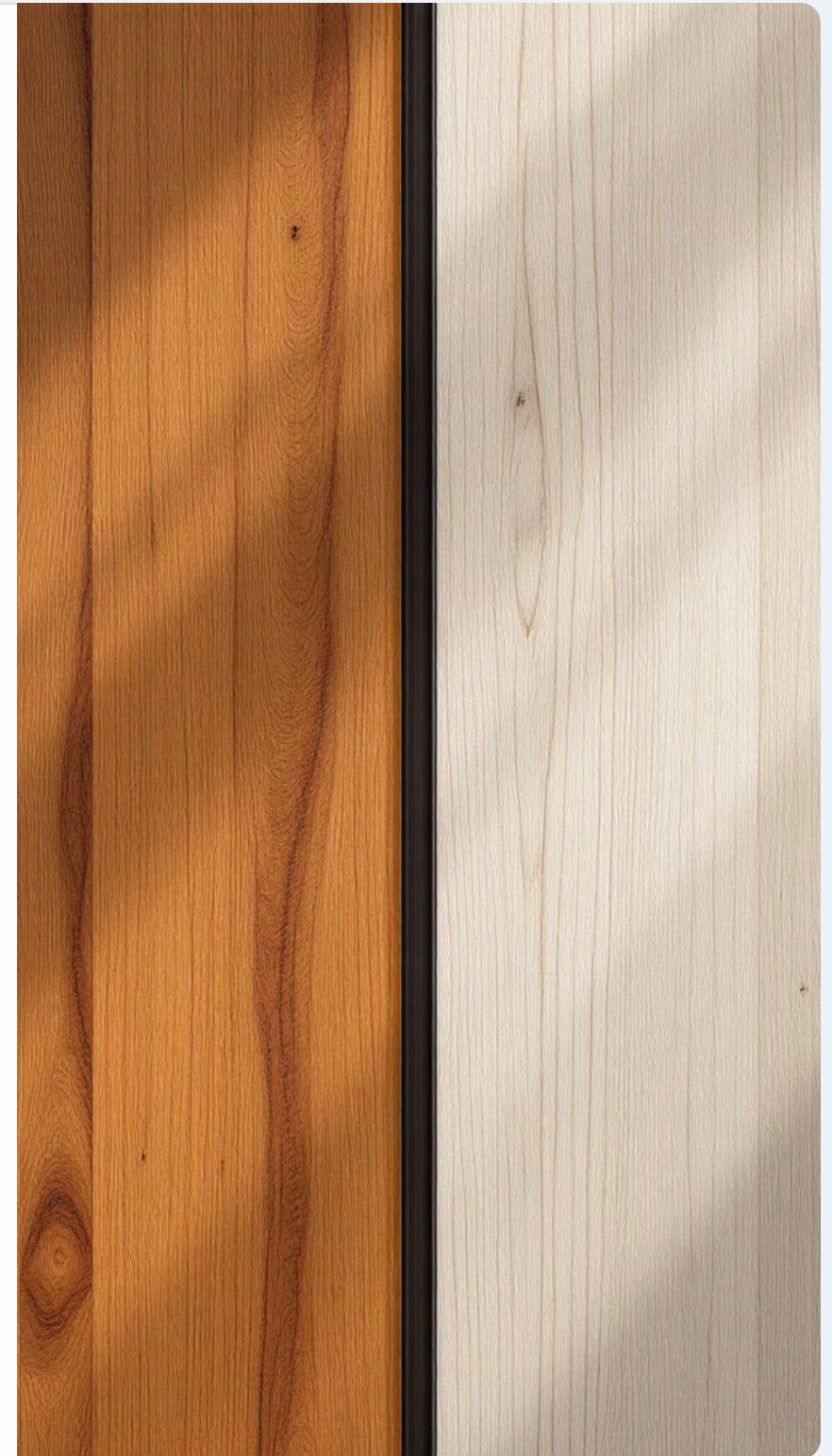
Hardwood Flooring

- Real wood that can be refinished multiple times
- Adds significant resale value to your home
- Sensitive to water and humidity changes
- Requires careful product selection for cleaning

Laminate Flooring

- Synthetic wood-look surface over fiberboard core
- More affordable and scratch-resistant option
- Cannot be refinished if damaged
- More forgiving with moisture but still needs care

Knowing your floor type is essential—each requires specific maintenance approaches to preserve beauty and extend lifespan.



Three Hidden Threats to Your Floors

Moisture Damage

Standing water warps hardwood and degrades laminate cores. Even humidity fluctuations cause expansion and contraction that leads to gaps and buckling over time.



Dirt and Grit

Tiny particles act like sandpaper under foot traffic, wearing down protective finishes. High-traffic areas show damage first, creating dull pathways across your floors.



Scratches and Scuffs

Furniture movement, pet claws, and dropped objects create surface damage. Without protection, these small marks accumulate and diminish your floor's appearance and value.

Essential Tools for Floor Care Success

Microfiber Mop System

Captures dirt without scratching and requires minimal water—the safest daily cleaning option for both floor types.

Felt Furniture Pads

Install on all furniture legs to prevent scratches and allow easy movement without floor damage.

Neutral pH Cleaner

Avoid harsh chemicals and all-purpose cleaners. pH-neutral formulas clean effectively without damaging protective finishes.

Soft-Bristle Vacuum

Use a hardwood floor attachment to remove debris without scratching. Never use beater bars on wood surfaces.

Your Floor Care Schedule



Daily Tasks

Sweep or vacuum high-traffic areas to remove dirt and grit. Wipe up any spills immediately with a dry or barely damp cloth.



Weekly Cleaning

Damp mop entire floor with neutral pH cleaner. Focus on entryways and kitchens where dirt accumulates most. Never leave standing water.



Monthly Maintenance

Polish hardwood floors with manufacturer-recommended products. Deep clean grout lines and edges. Check furniture pads and replace worn ones.



Seasonal Deep Clean

Inspect for damage or wear patterns. Consider professional cleaning to restore shine and protect finish. Adjust humidity levels as seasons change.

Emergency Spill Response



Act Fast to Prevent Damage

- **Blot immediately**

Use clean, absorbent cloth—
never let liquids sit on floors

- **Clean the area**

Wipe with barely damp
microfiber mop and neutral
cleaner

- **Dry completely**

Ensure no moisture remains to prevent warping or staining



Never use: Vinegar, steam cleaners, wax-based products, or abrasive scrubbers—these damage protective finishes permanently.

Warning Signs: Refinish or Replace?

Time to Refinish Hardwood

- Dull, worn finish that won't restore with polishing
- Deep scratches or gouges exposing bare wood
- Discoloration or water stains across large areas
- Splintering edges or gaps between boards

Professional refinishing can restore floors 3-5 times before replacement is needed.

Time to Replace Laminate

- Chipped or peeling surface layer that cannot be repaired
- Water damage causing swelling or buckling
- Separated planks or visible gaps at seams
- Fading or discoloration from sun exposure

Unlike hardwood, laminate cannot be refinished—damaged sections require full replacement.

Prevention: Your Best Defense

Strategic Rug Placement

Place entry mats at all doors to trap 80% of incoming dirt. Use area rugs in high-traffic zones and under dining tables to protect vulnerable areas.

Control Indoor Humidity

Maintain 35-55% humidity year-round using humidifiers or dehumidifiers. This prevents warping, gaps, and finish cracking from moisture fluctuations.

Pet Care Matters

Trim pet nails regularly to prevent scratches. Place mats under food and water bowls. Clean paw prints immediately to avoid moisture damage.

Furniture Protection

Use felt pads on all furniture legs and replace quarterly. Lift furniture when moving—never drag. Consider furniture coasters for heavy pieces.
